7 PROVISIONAL ARREST WARRANT

8 1. Upon receipt of information that a fugitive is in Nigeria,
9 suspected to be in or on his way into Nigeria, a Judge may issue a provisional
10 arrest warrant under section 8 of the Act, to bring the fugitive before the
11 Court.

12 2. Before issuing a provisional warrant of arrest upon information,
13 a Judge shall consider whether-

14 (a) the alleged offence is an extraditable offence; and

15 (b) there is sufficient evidence or information to justify the
16 issuance of a provisional warrant of arrest.

17 3. The provisional warrant of arrest shall direct that the fugitive to
18 be brought before the issuing Judge within 48 hours of effecting the arrest or
19 such longer period as the Court may deem reasonable.

- 1 **1.** The Money Laundering (Prevention and Prohibition) Act 2022
- 2 (in this Bill referred to as the Principal Act) is amended as follows-
- 3 **2.** Section 3 of the Principal Act is amended by including sub-
- 4 section 6, 7, 8 and 9 to read as follows:
- 5 (1) A transfer to or from a foreign country of funds or securities by a
- 6 person or body corporate including a money service business of a sum
- 7 exceeding US\$10,000 or its equivalent shall be reported to the Unit, Central
- 8 Bank of Nigeria and Securities and Exchange Commission in writing within
- 9 one day from the date of the transaction.
- 10 (2) A report made under subsection (1) shall indicate the nature and
- 11 amount of the transfer, the names and addresses of the sender and the
- 12 receiver of the funds or securities.
- 13 (3) Transportation of cash or negotiable instruments in excess of
- 14 US\$10,000 or its equivalent by individuals in or out of Nigeria shall be
- 15 declared to the Nigerian Customs Service.
- 16 (4) The Nigerian Customs Service shall report any declaration
- 17 made under subsection (3) to the Central Bank and the Unit.
- 18 (5) Any person who falsely declares or fails to make a declaration
- 19 to the Nigerian Customs Service under section 12 of the Foreign Exchange
- 20 (Monitoring and Miscellaneous Provisions) Act, commits an offence and is
- 21 liable on conviction to forfeit the undeclared funds or negotiable instrument

1 or to imprisonment for a term of at least two years or both.

2 (6) Upon discovery of a false declaration or disclosure of currency or
3 BNIs or a failure to declare or disclose them, the NCS or any other competent
4 authority shall have the authority to request and obtain further information
5 from the carrier with regard to the origin of the currency or BNIs, and their
6 intended use.

7 (7) The authorities referred to in subsection (6) above shall have the
8 authority to stop or restrain currency or BNIs for a reasonable time in order to
9 ascertain whether evidence of ML/TF may be found in cases: (a) where there is
10 a suspicion of ML/TF or predicate offences; or (b) where there is a false
11 declaration or false disclosure.

12 (8) To facilitate international cooperation and assistance, the Nigerian
13 Customs Service shall maintain up-to-date and accessible information on all
14 declarations that exceed the prescribed threshold, all false declarations and all
15 declarations that have a suspicion of money laundering or terrorist financing.

16 (9) All competent authorities shall put in place strict safeguards to
17 ensure proper use of information collected through the declaration/disclosure
18 systems, without restricting either: (i) trade payments between Nigeria and
19 other countries for goods and services; or (ii) the freedom of capital
20 movements, in any way.

24 communicated on demand to a competent authority and such other regulatory

26 Money Laundering may specify by order published in the Federal Government
27 Gazette.

28 (2) All competent authorities shall maintain comprehensive statistics
29 on:

30 (a) STRs, received and disseminated;

1 (b) ML/TF investigations, prosecutions and convictions;
 2 (c) Property frozen; seized and confiscated; and
 3 (d) Mutual legal assistance or other international requests for
 4 cooperation made and received.

5 (3) The records referred to in section 8 of this Act shall be
 6 communicated on demand to a competent authority upon appropriate
 7 authority.

8 (4) Competent authorities, supervisors, and SRBs shall establish
 9 guidelines and provide feedback, which will assist financial institutions and
 10 DNFBPs in applying national AML/CFT measures, and in particular, in
 11 detecting and reporting suspicious transactions.

12 4. The definition of "politically exposed persons (PEPs)" in
 13 Section 30 of the Principal Act be extended to includes -

 19 other than middle ranking or more junior individuals;

20 (b) individuals who are or have been entrusted domestically with
 21 prominent public functions, for example Heads of State or of Government,
 22 senior politicians, senior government, judicial or military officials, senior
 23 executives of State owned corporations and important political party
 24 officials, and their family members and close associates, other than middle
 25 ranking or more junior individuals;

26 (c) persons who are or have been entrusted with a prominent
 27 function by an international organization and includes members of senior
 28 management such as directors, deputy directors and members of the board
 29 or equivalent functions and their family members and close associates, other
 30 than middle ranking or more junior individuals in the foregoing categories;

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

This Bill seeks to amend the Money Laundering (Prevention and Prohibition) Act 2022 to extend the definition of foreign and domestic PEPs to their family members and close associates, to grant the Nigerian Custom Service (NCS) and other competent authorities the power to request and obtain further information upon discovery of false declaration, to mandate competent authorities to maintain comprehensive relevant AML/CFT statistics, establish guideline and provide feedbacks to FIs and DNFBPs.

PART I - OBJECTIVE

2 1. The objective of this Act is to provide for a comprehensive legal Objective
3 and Institutional framework for the establishment and operations of Nigeria
4 Police Force College, Training School and Institution for the provision of
5 specialized training to police officers in the field of policing and law
6 enforcement in order to enhance their performances in accordance with the
7 provisions of the Nigeria Police Act.

PART II - ESTABLISHMENT OF NIGERIA POLICE FORCE COLLEGE

8
9 2.-(1) There is established for the Nigeria Police Force, the Nigeria Establishment
10 Police Force College ("the College"). of Nigeria Police
Force College

11 (2) The College-

12 (a) shall be a body corporate with perpetual succession and a
13 common seal;

14 (b) may sue or be sued in its corporate name; and

15 (c) may acquire, hold, purchase, mortgage and deal with property,
16 movable or immovable, real or personal.

17 (3) The College shall-

18 (a) have power to award diplomas and certificates in accordance
19 with the academic and professional standards as may be prescribed by
20 appropriate authorities;

1 (b) provide basic law enforcement training, refresher and basic
2 operation courses on police duties to persons recruited into the Nigeria Police
3 Force;

4 (c) provide pioneer training programmes and refresher courses to
5 serving Police officers;

6 (d) encourage the advancement of higher law enforcement training;

7 (e) provide 'Train the Trainer' programmes to serving Police officers;

8 and

9 (f) provide advance courses to serving Police officer.

10 (4) The College shall, in addition to its main campus, establish at least
11 one campus in each of the six geo-political Zones of Nigeria, taking into
12 consideration the existing campuses set out under the First Schedule to this Act.

13 PART III - ESTABLISHMENT OF NIGERIA POLICE FORCE

15 3.-(1) There is established for the Nigeria Police Force, the Nigeria
16 Police Force Training School ("the Training School").

17 (2) The Training School-

18 (a) shall be a body corporate with perpetual succession and a common
19 seal;

20 (b) may sue or be sued in its corporate name; and

21 (c) may acquire, hold, purchase, mortgage and deal with property,
22 movable or immovable, real or personal.

23 (3) The Training School shall-

24 (a) have power to award its own certificates in accordance with the
25 highest academic and professional standards as may be prescribed by
26 appropriate authorities;

27 (b) train civilians recruited into the Nigeria Police Force to become
28 career Police Officers in accordance with best practices;

29 (c) provide basic law enforcement training to persons newly recruited
30 into the Nigeria Police Force;

1 (d) provide refresher and basic operation simulation courses on
2 police duties to persons recruited into the Nigeria Police Force; and

3 (b) on request, provide training to other Security Agencies upon the
4 approval of the Inspector - General of Police.

5 (4) The Training School shall, in addition to its main campus, establish at
6 least one campus in each of the six geo-political Zones of Nigeria, taking
7 into consideration the existing campuses set out under the Second Schedule
8 to this Act.

9 PART IV - ESTABLISHMENT OF NIGERIA POLICE FORCE TRAINING

10 INSTITUTION

11 4.-(1) There is established for the Nigeria Police Force, the
12 Nigerian Police Force Training Institution ("the Institution").

14 (a) be a body corporate with perpetual succession and a common
15 seal;

16 (b) may sue or be sued in its corporate name; and

17 (c) may acquire, hold, purchase, mortgage and deal with property,

19 (3) The Institution shall have power to-

20 (a) award certificates in accordance with academic and
21 professional standards as may be prescribed by appropriate authorities;

22 (b) provide basic tactical and technical law enforcement training to
23 serving Police officers;

24 (c) provide refresher training on tactical and technical law
25 enforcement to serving Police officer;

26 (d) encourage the assembling, repairs and manufacture of firearms
27 in accordance with learning curriculum;

28 (e) provide "Train the Trainer" programmes to serving Police
29 officer;

30 (f) provide training in technology, applied science, commerce and

1 management; and such other fields of applied learning relevant to the
 2 development of Nigeria in the area of-

3 (i) industrial and agricultural production,
 4 (ii) distribution,
 5 (iii) research development, and
 6 (iv) adaptation of techniques, and as the Management Committee
 7 may from time to time determine;

8 (g) arrange workshops, conferences, seminars and study groups
 9 relative to its fields of learning; and

10 (h) perform such other functions as in the opinion of the Management
 11 may serve to promote the objectives of technical and tactical training.

12 (4) The Training Institution shall, in addition to its main campus,
 13 establish at least one campus in each of the six geo-political Zones of Nigeria,
 14 taking into consideration the existing campuses set out under the Third
 15 Schedule to this Act.

16 **PART V - OBJECTS AND POWERS OF THE NIGERIA POLICE FORCE**

17 **COLLEGE, TRAINING SCHOOL AND INSTITUTION**

Objects of the
 College, Training

 Institution

18 **5.** The objects of the College, Training School and Institution are to-

19 (a) provide courses of instruction and other facilities for the pursuit of
 20 teaching and learning in all the courses relevant and related to the advancement
 21 of the Nigeria Police Force;

22 (b) provide training of Nigerians admitted into the Nigeria Police
 23 Force to be trained as officers and those already serving, with the standard
 24 required and expected of Police Force of the highest standard of world best
 25 practice;

26 (c) retrain serving police officers to become more professional in
 27 accordance with world best practices;

28 (d) encourage the advancement of learning and avail the officers of
 29 the Nigeria Police Force, without distinction of race, ethnicity, creed, sex,
 30 political conviction or religious persuasion, the opportunity of acquiring a

1 higher and liberal education;

2 (e) nurture, equip and produce globally competitive police officers
3 with requisite knowledge, skills and attitudes suitable for leadership,
4 scholarship, policing and community service;

5 (f) develop in each police officer, commitment to moral qualities,
6 standard and patriotism required for leadership that are defined by the ideals
7 of unity, honor and service to the country in the performance of policing and
8 security obligation in accordance with Nigeria Police Act and Regulations;

9 (g) encourage and promote scholarship, and conduct research in
10 relevant fields of learning and human endeavour in law enforcement and
11 security of Nigeria; and

12 (h) undertake other activities appropriate for a College, Training
13 School and Institution of higher learning in accordance with the provisions
14 of this Act.

15 **6.** For the purpose of attaining the objects outlined in section 5 of
16 this Act, the Powers of the College, Training School and Institution shall be
17 to-

18 (a) provide learning centres for the provision of introductory,
19 competent, ongoing and enhanced training for officers of the Nigeria Police
20 Force in order to advance the best practices in policing, national security and
21 law enforcement management;

22 (b) establish such teaching and research units within the College,
23 Training School or Institution, as may be necessary or desirable to develop
24 the officers of the Nigeria Police Force;

25 (c) Institute and award scholarships, exhibitions, bursaries,
26 medals, prizes, distinctions, awards and other forms of recognition or title to
27 deserving officers, subject to the approval of the Inspector - General of
28 Police;

29 (d) refer matters relating to the discipline of police officers in the
30 College, Training School and Institution in line with the laid down

- 1 procedures of the Nigerian Police Force;
- 2 (e) conduct examinations, award degrees, diplomas, certificates and
- 3 other distinctions to persons pursuing approved courses of studies and have
- 4 satisfied the requirements prescribed by the College, Training School and
- 5 Institution, or the appropriate authorities;
- 6 (f) conduct research in relevant fields of learning and human
- 7 endeavours;
- 8 (g) recommend to the Inspector - General of Police for the withdrawal
- 9 of any officer from the College, Training School or Institution for good cause,
- 10 post degree, diploma, certificate, fellowship, studentship, bursary, medal, prize
- 11 or other academic titles as deemed appropriate by the College, Training School
- 12 or Institution;
- 13 (h) accept gifts, legacies and donations, provided that the terms and
- 14 conditions attached to such gifts, legacies or donations are not inconsistent
- 15 with the objects of the College, Training School or Institution;

17 general or specific nature relating generally to matters regarding the
18 performance by the College, Training School or Institution established under
19 this Act of its functions and it shall be the duty of the College, Training School
20 or Institution to comply with the guidelines or directives.

Powers of the
Inspector-General
of Police

21 **34.-(1)** Subject to the provisions of this Act, the Inspector - General of
22 Police may make recommendations to a Management Committee to-

23 (a) establish a new Campus of the College, Training School or
24 Institution in any of the 6 geo-political Zone;

25 (b) regulate the activities and programmes of College, Training

 11 authorities, staff and trainees of a Campus of the College, Training School or

24 **38.-(1)** Trainees shall not be required to satisfy any requirements as to
25 race, ethnic group, sex, place of birth or family of origin, religious or political

28 Institution, appointment or employment.

29 (2) A person shall not be subjected to any disadvantage or accorded
30 any advantage, in the College, Training School or Training Institution, by

 23 the coming into effect of this Act are deemed to be Principal Officers of the
 24 Campuses of the College, Training School or Training Institution
 25 established under this Act under the same terms and conditions.

26 (2) Any person who was a member of staff or was employed by any
 27 of the Colleges, Training Schools or Training Institutions before the coming
 28 into effect of this Act, shall continue in office and be deemed to have been
 29 appointed under this Act for purposes of Pension.

30 (3) Properties held immediately before the commencement date of

1 this Act on behalf of the any College, Training School or Training Institution by
2 any person shall, by virtue of this Act, be vested in the College, Training School
3 or Training Institution established under this Act.

4 (4) Any Campus of the College, Training School or Training
5 Institution established under this Act shall be subject to all the obligations and
6 liabilities to which the former colleges, Training Schools or Training
7 Institutions were subject to immediately before the commencement of this Act
8 and all other persons shall have the same rights, powers and remedies against
9 the College, Training School or Training Institution established by this Act as
10 they had against any of the Colleges, Training Schools or Training Institutions
11 immediately before the commencement of this Act.

12 (5) Any proceeding or cause of action pending or existing
13 immediately before the commencement of this Act by or against the College,

10 Police Act;

11 "Officer" means a staff of senior rank holding an administrative post, but
12 does not include Visitor and members of the Management Committee;

13 "NIN" means National Identity Number;

14 "prescribed" means prescribed by law, Statutes or regulations;

15 "President" means President of the Federal Republic of Nigeria;

16 "Principal Officer" means the officers mentioned in Part II of this Act;

17 "property" includes rights and assets;

18 "regulations" includes rules and regulations made pursuant to the provisions
19 of this Act;

20 "Visitor" means the Minister of the government of the Federation Minister
21 responsible for Police Affairs responsible for police affairs or his designate;

7 *Proceedings of the Management Committee*

8 1.-(1) Subject to this Act and section 27 of the Interpretation Act, the
9 Management Committee shall have power to regulate its proceedings and may
10 make standing orders with respect to the holding of its meetings, and those of
11 its Committees or sub-committees, notices to be given, the keeping of minutes
12 of its proceedings, the custody and production for inspection of such minutes
13 and such other matters as the Management Committee may, from time to time
14 determine.

15 (2) There shall be at least one ordinary meeting of the Management
16 Committee in each quarter of the year and subject thereto, the Management
17 Committee shall meet whenever it is convened by the Chairman, and if the
18 Chairman is requested to do so by notice given to him by not less than four
19 other members, he shall convene a meeting of the Management Committee to
20 be held within 30 days from the date on which the notice was given.

21 (3) Every meeting of the Management Committee shall be presided
22 over by the Chairman and if the Chairman is unable to attend a particular
23 meeting, the members present at the meeting shall elect one of them to preside
24 at the meeting.

25 (4) The minutes of meetings of the Management Committee shall be
26 recorded by the Secretary and signed by the Chairman or the person who
27 presided at the meeting, after confirmation by the Management Committee.

28 (5) A quorum at a meeting of the Management Committee shall be
29 one-third of the total number of members.

Convening of Emergency Meetings of the Management Committee

2.-(1) The Chairman shall, at any time, if five other members request in writing, convene an emergency meeting of the Management Committee, provided that not less than 48 hours' notice is given to members for the meeting.

(2) Where the office of Chairman is at any time vacant, or the Chairman is absent from Nigeria or is in the opinion of the Management Committee permanently or temporarily unable to perform the functions of his office, Controller - General shall convene such meetings of the Management Committee as are required during the period of vacancy, absence or otherwise.

(3) The Management Committee shall meet for the conduct of its business at such places and on such days as the Chairman may appoint.

Voting

3.-(1) A question put before the Management Committee at a meeting shall be decided by consensus and where this is not possible, by a majority of the votes of the members present and voting.

(2) The Chairman shall, in the case of an equality of votes, have a casting vote in addition to his deliberative vote.

(3) Where the Management Committee seeks the advice of any person on a particular matter, the Management Committee may invite that person to attend for such period as it deems fit, but a person who is invited by virtue' of this paragraph shall not be entitled to vote at any meeting of the Management Committee and shall not count towards the quorum.

Sub-Committees

4.-(1) The Management Committee may appoint one or more sub-committees to carry out on behalf of the Management Committee such of its functions as the Management Committee may determine and report on any matter with which the Management Committee is concerned.

(2) A Sub-committee appointed under sub-paragraph (1) of this

1 Paragraph shall be presided over by a member of the Management Committee
2 and shall consist of such number of persons (not necessarily all members of the
3 Committee) as, may be determined by the Management Committee, and a
4 person other than a member of the Management Committee shall hold office on
5 the Sub - committee in accordance with the, terms of his appointment.

6 (3) A person who is not a member of the Management Committee

19 (3) A member of the Management Committee who has a personal
20 interest in any contract or arrangement entered into or proposed to be
21 considered by the Management Committee shall disclose his or her interest to
22 the Management Committee or any sub-committee shall-

23 (a) disclose his interest to the Management Committee or sub-

25 (b) not vote on any question relating to the arrangement.

26 (4) Members of the Management Committee shall submit a written
27 statement of disclosure of interests and a statement of absence of conflicts with

30 6.-(1) The validity of any proceeding of the Management Committee

- 1 or its sub-committees shall not be affected by-
- 2 (a) any vacancy in the membership of the Management Committee

- 6 (c) any defect in the appointment of a member.
- 7 (3) A resolution of the Management Committee is valid, even

1 purpose of screening, interviewing and selection of qualified candidates for
2 admission into the Academy whose membership shall consist of-

3 (a) a Commissioner from the Police Service Commission who
4 shall be the Chairman;

5 (b) a representative of the Management Committee;

6 (c) the Commandant;

7 (d) the Camp Commandant;

8 (e) the Registrar;

9 (f) Principal officers;

10 (g) the Director of Police Services in the Ministry responsible for
11 Police Affairs;

12 (h) the Director in charge of recruitment from the Police Service
13 Commission;

14 (i) a representative of the Nigeria Police Force Headquarters not
15 below the rank of Commissioner of Police;

16 (j) Heads of Departments;

17 (k) a representative of the Federal Character Commission as
18 observer;

19 (l) the Deputy Registrar of the Campus in charge of admissions
20 who shall serve as Secretary to the Admission Selection Committee.

21 (2) The functions of the Admission Selection Committee shall
22 include, to-

23 (a) screen and interview qualified candidates invited for selection
24 interview by the Campus of the College, Training School or Training
25 Institution

26 (b) disqualify any candidate found deficient in any aspect of the
27 screening processes;

28 (c) apply the screening criteria that are in use for the selection
29 process of Police officers that may be determined by the Police Service
30 Commission, from time to time;

1 (d) ensure the observance of all the requirements for admission into
2 Higher Institutions by the regulatory bodies such as National Universities
3 Commission and Joint Admissions and Matriculations Board; and

4 (e) select qualified candidates to be admitted into the Academy in
5 each admission year.

6 (3) The decision of the Selection Committee on admission shall be
7 final subject to the approval of the Management Committee.

8 *Academic, Instructional and Curriculum Development Committee*

9 7.-(1) The Academic and Curriculum Development Committee shall
10 consist of the-

11 (a) Commandant of the Campus of the College, Training School or
12 Training Institution as the Chairman;

13 (b) the Deputy Commandant;

14 (c) Heads of Departments;

15 (d) Director of Academic Planning;

16 (e) Bursar;

17 (f) Librarian;

18 (g) Director of Police Training or Courses; and

19 (h) Registrar as a member and Secretary.

20 (2) Quorum shall be 50% of the members including the Commandant.

21 (3) The Academic Committee shall have sub-committees including -

22 (a) academic Planning and Curriculum;

23 (b) Development Sub-Committee;

24 (c) Library and Publications Sub-Committee;

25 (d) Ceremonies Sub-Committee;

26 (e) Research Grant Sub-Committee;

27 (f) Trainees' Welfare Sub-Committee; and

28 (g) Sports Sub-Committee;

29 *Library and Publications Committee*

30 8.-(1) The Library and Publication Committee shall consist of -

1 (a) the Librarian of the Campus as Chairman;
2 (b) one representative of each Department; and
3 (c) the Registrar or his representative who shall serve as the
4 Secretary.

5 (2) The functions of the Committee shall be to-

6 (a) assist and advise the Campus on the development of the Library
7 as the center of learning and research;

8 (b) formulate regulations for the use of the Library and its facilities;

9 (c) help prepare the Library budget;

10 (d) select and recommend manuscripts for publications by the
11 Campus;

12 (e) supervise the production of official publications that shall bear
13 the emblem of the Campus;

14 (f) regulate the development and the use of e-library; and

15 (g) undertake other related tasks that may be assigned to the sub-
16 committee by the Academic Committee.

17 (3) The quorum of the Committee is 50% of the members including
18 the Chairman of the Committee.

19 *Ceremonies Committee*

20 9.-(1) There shall be a Ceremonies Committee, which shall consist
21 of-

22 (a) a nominee of the Commandant as Chairman;

23 (b) staff representative of each Department;

24 (c) representative of the Librarian;

25 (d) representative of the Bursar;

26 (e) representative of the Director Physical Planning;

27 (f) representative of the Protocol and Public Relations Units;

28 (g) representative of the Security Unit;

29 (h) representative of the Catering Services; and

1 (i) representative of the Registrar who shall serve as Secretary to the
2 Committee.

3 (2) The quorum of the Committee shall be 50% of members including
4 the Chairman.

5 (3) The ceremonies Committee shall be responsible for-

6 (a) organizing public events of the Campus;

7 (b) recommending to the Academic Committee persons to be
8 considered for the award of honorary degrees; and

9 (c) advising the College, Training School or Institution on issues
10 concerning ceremonial matters generally.

11 *Research Grant Committee*

12 10.-(1) There shall be a Research Grant Committee which shall
13 consist of-

14 (a) an appointee of the Commandant as Chairman;

15 (b) a representative of each Departments and Units;

16 (c) a representative of the Information and Communications
17 Technology (ICT) Centre;

18 (d) the Director of Academic Planning;

19 (e) the Librarian; and

20 (f) a representative of the Registrar who shall serve as the Secretary to
21 the Committee.

22 (2) The quorum of the Committee shall be 50% of members including
23 the Chairman.

24 (3) The Committee shall be responsible for-

25 (a) assessing research projects submitted by Departments, Units and
26 members of staff, and approve those with merit or support with research grant;

27 (b) administering research funds of the Campus;

28 (c) receiving, considering and recommending Staff Development for
29 each Department to appropriate organs and ensure compliance when approved;

30 and

1 (d) advise the Academic Committee and other relevant
2 Committees on matters concerning research policy and practice in the
3 Campus of the College, Training School or Training Institution

4 *Committee of Academic Directors and Heads of Departments*

5 11.-(1) There shall be a Committee of Deans and Academic
6 Directors which shall consist of-

7 (a) the Commandant or his representative as Chairman;

8 (b) Heads of Departments and Units;

9 (c) a Member of the Management Committee as an observer; and

10 (d) the Registrar or his representative who shall serve as the
11 Secretary to the Committee.

12 (2) The functions of the Committee shall be to-

13 (a) review from time to time, the minimum entry requirement for
14 programmes of the Campus;

15 (b) formulate for the consideration of the Academic Committee,
16 regulations governing the conduct of examinations in the Campus;

17 (c) review the existing regulation from time to time, for appropriate
18 recommendation to the Academic Committee;

19 (d) considers matters on examinations as may be referred to it by
20 the Academic Committee;

21 (e) make recommendation to the Academic Committee on
22 academic matters as it deems necessary; and

23 (f) undertake either related task as may be assigned by the
24 Academic Committee.

25 *Business Committee*

26 12.-(1) There shall be for the Academy a Business Committee,
27 which shall consist of-

28 (a) a nominee of the Commandant who shall be a member of the
29 Academic Committee as Chairman;

30 (b) other 3 members nominated by the Academic Committee as it

1 deems necessary;

2 (c) a representative of each Department;

3 (d) a Member of the Management Committee; and

4 (e) the Registrar or his representative who shall be the Secretary to the
5 Committee.

6 (2) The quorum of the Committee shall be 50% of members including
7 the Chairman and the Secretary.

8 (3) The Business Committee shall be responsible for-

9 (a) preparing the agenda for each Academic Committee meeting; and

10 (b) dealing with matters referred to it by the Academic Committee
11 from time to time.

12 *The Police Training Committee*

13 13. -(1) The Police Training Committee shall consist of -

14 (a) the Director of Police Training Affairs, who shall be the Chairman;

15 (b) the Chief Instructor, Field Studies;

16 (c) the Chief Instructor, Professional Studies;

17 (d) the Chief Instructor, Legal Studies;

18 (e) the Chief Instructor, Liberal Studies;

19 (f) two representatives to be appointed by the Commandant;

20 (g) a Member of the Management Committee; and

21 (h) the Registrar or his designate, who shall be the Secretary.

(2) Subject to the provision of this Act, the Police Training Committee shall, in relation to its teaching unit -

(a) advise relevant constituent bodies on all matters relating to organizing police training, instructions and research into police aspects of the subject taught by that teaching unit of the Campus, including the curricula and the examinations connected therewith;

(b) monitor and regulate the conduct and progress of cadets in that teaching units and report thereon to the Academy Board;

30 (c) deliberate on the performance of all cadets in police subject at the

1 end of each semester; and

2 (d) determine passes and failure of cadets at all times, in
3 accordance with the criteria set for passing and failing as laid down in the
4 Academy assessment policy for police subjects.

5 (3) The Police Training Committee shall determine and
6 recommend to the Coordination Committee in accordance with extant
7 policy, the trainees who-

8 (a) are qualified for graduation, pass out or be commissioned;

9 (b) deserve to be given awards, such as the-

10 (i) Sword of honour;

11 (ii) Gold medals; and

12 (iii) Silver medal.

13 (c) promotion to the next higher class;

14 (d) deserves to be allowed to resit for papers failed in any police
15 subject;

16 (e) deserve to be warned for poor performance in papers in police
17 subjects and certain aspects of cadet life;

18 (f) deserve to be relegated to the next lower class for poor
19 performance; or

20 (g) deserve to be withdrawn from the Academy for poor
21 performance.

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

*(This memorandum does not form part of this Act but is intended
to explain its purport)*

This Bill seeks to provide for a comprehensive legal and Institutional framework for the establishment and operations of Nigeria Police Force College, Training School and Training Institution and their campuses for the provision of holistic and specialized training in any professional field relevant to policing and law enforcement, in order to enhance their performances in accordance with the provisions of the Nigeria Police Act and the highest academic standards.
